The AVV will arrange for the vehicle to be entered on the Register of Approved Vehicles (RAV) once it is verified as meeting legislative requirements. See attachment A2 for further details.

The approval holder, or a person authorised by the approval holder in writing, is permitted to import the road vehicle to which this approval decision applies.

## Attachment A – Conditions of approval and additional information

### Road vehicle importation

In accordance with section 22 of the *Road Vehicle Standards Act 2018* (RVSA) and section 146 of the *Road Vehicle Standards Rules 2019* (Rules), the holder of this concessional RAV entry approval, or a person authorised in writing by the holder of this concessional RAV entry approval, is permitted to import the road vehicle to which this approval applies.

### Conditions of the approval

Concessional RAV entry approval CRE-021549 is subject to a range of conditions. The breach of a condition of an approval is a serious matter. The approval holder is reminded of their obligations to comply with the conditions of approval, as set out in section 28 of the RVSA. Potential penalties for a breach of a condition of an approval may include but are not limited to:

- suspension or revocation of the approval
- an infringement notice of 12 penalty units for executive officers of a company or individuals, or 60 penalty units for a company
- court action such as civil penalty proceedings or criminal prosecution, which could result in a maximum penalty of 120 penalty units.

Two types of conditions apply to this approval:

#### Standard conditions

Standard conditions apply to all concessional RAV entry approvals and are set out in Part 3, Division 3 of the Rules. A summary of these conditions is set out in **Attachment A1**.

#### Specified conditions

In accordance with Part 3, Division 3, Subdivision C of the Rules, this concessional RAV entry approval may be subject to additional conditions as specified in **Attachment A2**.

### Recalls of approved road vehicles

Approval holders that intend to supply this vehicle in trade or commerce are reminded that concessional RAV entry approval holders of new and used road vehicles may have obligations related to vehicle recalls. Recall obligations are set out in Part 3 of the RVSA and Part 8 of the Rules.

Attachment A1 – Standard conditions of the concessional RAV entry approval

The standard conditions for all concessional RAV entry approvals are set out in Part 3, Division 3 of the Rules and automatically apply to this approval. Each of the following requirements is a condition of a concessional RAV entry approval:

Section 33 - Condition about allowing or arranging for an inspection of the vehicle

The holder of a concessional RAV entry approval must, on request by the Department, allow or arrange for the Department to inspect the vehicle.

Section 49 - Condition about providing information to the Department

A holder of a concessional RAV entry approval must, on request by the Department, within the reasonable time specified in the request:

- provide any information or documents specified in the request:
  - that the Department reasonably requires for the purposes of assessing whether the holder of the approval is complying with the RVSA, the Rules, or an instrument made under that Act or Rules or
  - about the vehicle to which the approval applies and
- provide written answers to questions, specified in the request, about the road vehicle covered by the approval.

## Attachment A2 – Specified conditions

This approval may also be subject to specified conditions. The approval holder must comply with these conditions before the vehicle can be entered onto the RAV.

In accordance with section 47 of the Rules, the following specified conditions apply to this approval:

- This vehicle with Chassis number CP9A0105844 has been issued a Vehicle Identification Number (VIN) to meet the requirements for adding a vehicle to the Register of Approved Vehicles. The VIN has incorporated the Chassis number where the format of the Chassis number meets the acceptable layout of a VIN.
- The VIN issued to the vehicle in this approval must be permanently marked on, or affixed to, an integral part of the vehicle, in line with the requirements of the registration authority of the state or territory where the vehicle will be presented for registration.

## Section 48 - Condition about road vehicles to be modified by a RAW

In accordance with section 48 of the Rules, the following specified condition applies to this approval:

- The road vehicle to which this approval applies must not be entered on the RAV until
  - the holder of a Registered Automotive Workshop Approval (RAW) approval has modified or manufactured the vehicle in accordance with the requirements set out in an approved Model Report that applies to the vehicle and
  - the holder of an Authorised Vehicle Verifier (AVV) approval has verified the vehicle, or modifications of the vehicle, in accordance with section 100 of the Rules.
