SELLING TRANSFORMERS

In order to sell a transformer, we need to ensure we follow the points bellow

- 1. If it is built in Australia prior to 1979 it may contain PCB's and cannot be sold
- 2. If it was imported into Australia prior to 1986 it may contain PCB's and cannot be sold
- 3. If the transformer is as described in points 1 or 2 it cannot be sold even if it is emptied of oil. An empty transformer is still regarded as contaminated
- 4. If the transformer has a Nata Approved certificate stating it has less than 1 part per million, they can be sold regardless of production or import age. This certificate must be attached to the sale description as proof of compliance.
